

The New York State Speech-Language-Hearing Association Scholarship Program will award two scholarships in 2023. One **\$500** scholarship will be awarded to an undergraduate applicant and one **\$500** scholarship will be awarded to a graduate applicant.

How the Program Works

Undergraduate and graduate students must submit a scholarship application and supporting materials to the NYSSLHA office by February 27, 2023. Applicants will be judged by a panel of judges on the following criteria:

Research Involvement

Research involvement is judged on a research project, which includes the following information:

- Title of Project
- Abstract (not to exceed 75 words)
- Summary (not to exceed 500 words) The summary should include a brief literature review with a rationale for the research study, methodology, results, and conclusion.
- Biographies of the student(s) and faculty mentor
- Measurable Learning Outcomes (minimum of three)
- References

Academic Performance

Academic performance is judged on transcript(s), academic letter(s) of recommendation, academic awards and nominations, independent studies, and any other significant achievements.

Clinical Performance (GRADUATE STUDENTS ONLY)

Clinical performance is judged on clinical references, awards, and achievements and experiences in clinical settings.

Pre-professional Involvement/Leadership

Pre-professional involvement and leadership is judged upon membership in speech-language-hearing organizations and/or support groups, participation on committees, elected offices, or other leadership roles outside the field of speech-language and hearing.

Community Involvement

Community involvement is judged on volunteerism, employment, and/or membership in community groups or clubs.

Essay

Please provide an essay answering the following. Essay should not exceed 350 words.

Why are you pursuing speech-language pathology or audiology as a career?

Selection Criteria

- The applicant must be a student member in good standing of the New York State Speech-Language-Hearing Association.
- The applicant must be matriculating in a speech-language pathology, audiology or speech and hearing sciences program.
- Only student-generated research will be accepted and all students must have a faculty mentor.

Students submitting the two highest scoring applications at each level may be interviewed by the committee if deemed necessary to determine the winner. Winners will be notified by **April 15, 2022**. If there is more than one author on the research project, all authors must submit information for each of the above criteria and all will share the total amount of the scholarship. All applicants are encouraged to attend the NYSSLHA convention and to be recognized by the Association at the Honors and Awards ceremony. Presentation of your research project as a poster at the convention is encouraged.

Undergraduate Level Criteria

Your scholarship submission will be judged on the following criteria.

I. Research Involvement

20 pts.

Judged on a research proposal, to include the following:

- Title of Project
- Abstract (< 75 words)
- Summary (< 500 words): Literature review, rationale for research study, methodology, results, and conclusion.
- Biographies of the student(s) and faculty mentor
- References
- Learning Outcomes (minimum of three)

II. Academic Performance

20 pts.

Based on transcript(s), academic letter(s) of recommendation and other information, including academic awards and nominations, independent studies, and any other achievements.

III. Pre-Professional Involvement/Leadership 20 pts.

Judged on membership in S/L/H organizations and/or support groups, participation on committees, elected offices, or other leadership roles in or out of field.

IV. Community Involvement

20 pts.

Judged on volunteerism, employment, and membership in community groups or clubs.

V. Essay

20 pts.

Why did you decide to pursue speech-language pathology or audiology as a career?

a. Content and Organization (10 pts.)b. Clarity (5 pts.)c. Spelling and Grammar (5 pts.)

Graduate Level Criteria

Your scholarship submission will be judged on the following criteria.

Please note: Graduate level is defined as enrolled full-time in an entry level or advanced level academic degree for professional level certification candidacy in speech-language pathology, audiology, or speech and hearing science program.

I. Research Involvement

20 pts.

Judged on a research proposal, to include the following:

- Title of Project
- Abstract (< 75 words)
- Summary (< 500 words): Literature review, rationale for research study, methodology, results, and conclusion.
- Biographies of the student(s) and faculty mentor
- References
- Learning Outcomes (minimum of three)

II. Academic Performance

20 pts.

Based on transcript(s), academic letter(s) of recommendation and other information, including academic awards and nominations, independent studies, and any other achievements.

III. Clinical Performance/Experience

20 pts.

Based on clinical references, awards, and achievements and experiences in clinical settings.

IV. Pre-Professional Involvement/Leadership 10 pts.

Judged on membership in S/L/H organizations and/or support groups; participation on committees, elected offices, or other leadership roles in or out of field; volunteerism; employment; and membership in community groups or clubs.

V. Community Involvement

10 pts.

Judged on volunteerism, employment, and membership in community groups or clubs.

VI. Essay

20 pts.
